HUMAN ENGINEERING

Our science behind transforming Rural India

Every village in India has different village dynamics. Each of their geographies, histories and ecologies differ, which affects their environmental conditions, mind-sets, traditions and societal practices. That's the reason, one single development formula does not work for them all

At Bharat Forge, we make 'human engineering' the foundation of every initiative. Interaction and

discussions with villagers and local influencers gives us an insight into their real problems and needs. This research doesn't just form the basis of every step we take, but also helps in acceptance of change for the villagers, giving way to better application and functioning of our initiatives



Our land-levelling project transformed a farmer's life!



Land-levelling done in the farm

Dagadu Ganpati Pardhi had spent all his life working as a hired labourer in farms in Thakarwadi. He had a quarter of an acre of land in the village, which he had bought for future security. It was a barren piece of land, but only until Bharat Forge conducted its land-levelling program. For the first time ever, his land yielded potato crop and money for him.

With his earnings, he bought a few goats. We build cattle sheds for him and now he has 20 goats, and a quarter acre of fertile cultivable land.

With our efforts, Dagadu Ganpati Pardhi earned ₹48,000 and a self-sustaining livelihood. Life-changing, indeed!

WATER AVAILABILITY - Agricultural Water

Endeavouring a **Drought-free** Maharashtra

Addressing the water crisis in the country, Bharat Forge has set its goal of 100 villages to be developed and made drought-free by 2020, out of which, 69 villages have already been developed with appropriate infrastructure for water conservation and storage.

Contributing to the government's water initiative, Jalyukt Shivar, Bharat Forge is developing 100 villages to be made drought-free by 2020.

In 2018, we worked in 69 villages, accomplished water storage capacity of 90,52,25,000 litres and touched over 1,00,000 lives!







LAND-LEVELLING

Creating better lives with better opportunities

Land-levelling Projects:

For converting barren lands, into lands suitable for farming, Bharat Forge undertook many land-levelling projects in Maharashtra, this year. This helped villagers grow more crops and upgrade their income significantly, opening up better opportunities for their families.

Our land levelling projects got '1451.5 R' land under irrigation, enhancing the annual income of 92 villagers.

WOMEN HEALTH

Empowering women with the power of well-being

We believe real upliftment of women starts with their health. Under our health initiatives, we focus mainly on making rural women more aware about their health, guide them about proper diet and nutrition and focus on early diagnosis of breast and cervical cancer.

Rural Health Initiatives in FY 2018-19: Cancer screening and haemoglobin checking camp and awareness sessions for the women in 12 villages from district Satara in association with the NGO - Samvedana by Sahyadri Hospitals, Pune & Karad.

Women from 12 villages participated in the camp, and check-ups for approximately 1,562 women were conducted. The cases for further investigation were referred to Sahyadri Hospital Karad.

| Borgaon : The village didn't have a crematorium for the last 80 years. Bharat Forge is building one.

| Nagzari : De-silting of Pazar talav. Record production of ginger due to rich silt and water.

Contributing to the Prime Minister's agenda of constructing toilets in schools, Bharat Forge's Mission 'Sanitation of School' has taken school sanitation, a level ahead.

Under this initiative, every year we build toilets and look after the maintenance and repair-work of government schools in the villages. Our social workers provide formal orientation to students in batches, about the usage and maintenance of toilets. They also ensure and facilitate adequate water supply for the sanitary maintenance.


